The City of Los Angeles invests nearly \$1 billion per year in our regional homelessness response. This report tracks the impact and performance of the areas in which the City makes the most significant investments. The goal of this report is to track how effectively the City's investments are working to: (1) help people come inside and into safety as quickly as possible; (2) help people successfully move from interim housing to permanent housing; and (3) leverage all of the City's investments in permanent housing to dramatically reduce homelessness. This report includes performance data on interim and permanent housing; future reports will also include data on citywide outreach.

The technical appendix to this report specifies the data source and methodology used to calculate each data point.
